PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



In June of 1940, Aristides de Sousa Mendes, the Portuguese Consul-General in Bordeaux, France, was faced with real human suffering. Refugees by the thousands clamored for Portuguese visas as they escaped persecution and war. The crowds multiplied by the day, and pressure mounted. But the Portuguese government was intransigent and forbade the issuance of visas to Jews, Russians, stateless refugees and others without prior approval. Time was of

the essence, as the Nazis were approaching Bordeaux. What could he do? What **should** he do?

Sousa Mendes, at great personal risk, chose to follow his conscience. In a short period of time, he issued visas to thousands of refugees, thereby saving their lives. And he never regretted his decision. "I could not have acted otherwise," he declared.

Now, more than ever, the work of the Foundation is urgent and timely. Our educational programming brings the moving and powerful story of Sousa Mendes to communities from coast to coast in order to **promote the value of moral courage** and apply the lessons of history to today's world.

Let us face this task together!



PORTUGAL'S HIGHEST HONOR

n Monday, April 3, 2017, Portugal's President Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa bestowed a posthumous decoration on Aristides de Sousa Mendes: the **Grand Cross of the Order of Liberty**. Receiving it in front of the Sousa Mendes family home in Portugal was Gerald Mendes, grandson of Aristides de Sousa Mendes. "This is a very special honor," remarked President

Rebelo de Sousa, "given at a time when the tragedies of new wars and persecutions bring painful images of rootless people looking for a land of freedom, in what is today the worst refugee crisis since the Second World War." With each new honor comes justice for a man who saved so many lives and was so harshly punished. At a time when the world needs heroes, Aristides de Sousa Mendes is now achieving a level of public appreciation that matches his place in history.

n Friday, January 27, 2017, the Holocaust Museum Houston paid tribute to Aristides de Sousa Mendes and the refugees that he saved. Louis-Philippe Mendes, grandson of the hero, gave the keynote address at the event marking International Holocaust Remembrance Day. "My grandfather's story is relevant to today's world," he told the audience, "and we must remain vigilant." The exhibit "Sousa Mendes and his Visas to Freedom," curated and lent by the Sousa Mendes Foundation, was on view at the Museum until the middle of March.



EXHIBITION ON RESCUERS AT THE HOLOCAUST AND HUMAN RIGHTS CENTER OF MAINE

The Holocaust and Human Rights Center of Maine presented an exhibit, "Heroism in Unjust Times: Rescuers During the Holocaust" on Wednesday, from May 2-August 11, 2017 at the Michael Klahr Center, located on the campus of the University of Maine at Augusta.

Aside from Sousa Mendes, other rescuers featured in the exhibit included Oskar Schindler, responsible for saving approximately 1,200 Jewish men, women and children; Raoul Wallenberg, who saved as many as 100,000 Hungarian Jews; Father Bruno (Henri Reynders), who protected 300-400 Jews, most of them children; and Muslim-Albanian families who saved Jews.

"Heroism in Unjust Times" was co-curated by the Sousa Mendes Foundation and featured objects and documents graciously lent by Ruth Hymans Charchat, Rudolph and Janet de Winter, Marilyn Eisenbruch Jacques, Jean-Claude van Itallie, Monique Rubens Krohn, Edith Kubicek, Sebastian Mendes, Kathleen Rand, Benjamin Schlesinger, Georgette Lorié Standish, Mona Pearl Treyball, and others. n the Portuguese-Spanish border stands a new museum opened in August 2017, "Vilar Formoso, Fronteira da Paz," telling the story of Aristides de Sousa Mendes and the refugees of 1940. This project was



designed by the architect Luisa Pacheco Marques with historical consultant Margarida Ramalho. The Sousa Mendes Foundation supplied images of the families that received visas from Aristides de Sousa Mendes along with artifacts such as passports and visas and an original doll.

n 2017, the Sousa Mendes Foundation brought another group of visa recipient families on a pilgrimage to retrace the footsteps of Aristides de Sousa Mendes and the refugees of 1940. Participants came from France, Germany, Portugal, the United States, and even Cuba. Visa recipient Lissy Jarvik, who came on the trip in 2016 with her sons and daughter-in-law returned in 2017 with her son and granddaughters. This was the first time that we have had three generations of a family making the trip together, and it was extra meaningful.

Highlights of the tour were the Bordeaux bust of Aristides de Sousa Mendes, Portuguese consulates Bordeaux and Bayonne where the visas were issued, Bordeaux the synagogue where refugees gathered, the "bridge to freedom" connecting France

and Spain, the new "Frontier of Peace" museum in the Spanish-Portuguese border village of Vilar Formoso, the Sousa Mendes family home in Cabanas de Viriato, the refugee quarter and synagogue in Porto, the synagogue

in Lisbon, and the Presidential Palace where we were received by the President himself. At each stop along the Journey, participants shared family stories, testimonials, tears, and laughter.

Since its inception in 2010, the Sousa Mendes Foundation has had as one of its prime objectives helping to raise funds for the creation of a memorial museum in his family home, Casa do Passal, in Cabanas de Viriato. The project to restore the home and transform it into a memorial museum entered the important Phase II in July 2017 with the launching of an architectural Concept Competition.

Casa do Passal has been unoccupied since Aristides de Sousa Mendes died in Lisbon in 1954 and his family dispersed. It was purchased by Fundação Aristides de Sousa Mendes (FASM) in 2001 with funds from the Portuguese Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and classified as a Portuguese National Monument in 2011. Having fallen into ruin with the collapse of the roof, the home was saved in 2014 with emergency restoration work (Phase I) by the regional heritage authorities, Direção Regional de Cultura do Centro (DRCC), to the great joy and relief of the growing number of admirers of Aristides de Sousa Mendes worldwide. Although the interior is not yet restored, the house is becoming one of the most photographed sites in the region.

The Concept Competition, spearheaded by the Municipality of Carregal do Sal, with technical assistance from DRCC, was open to architects qualified to practice in Portugal, and six proposals were submitted on

September 25, 2017. The Competition is a formal public procurement procedure, since the Phase II work will again be supported by public funds, including grants from the European Union, with publication in the platform www.acingov.pt. The proposals were evaluated and ranked by a jury, and the results were presented publicly on November 6, 2017.

The winner of the contract will be announced by the Municipality in 2018. Then, there will be open public hearings to further define the contents of the project. The Sousa Mendes Foundation plans to participate in this process on behalf of the visa recipient families worldwide.
