OUR MISSION

Founded in 2010, the Sousa Mendes Foundation is dedicated to honoring the memory of the Holocaust rescuer Aristides de Sousa Mendes and to educating the public about his action. It has a two-fold mission: raising funds for the restoration of the Sousa Mendes ancestral home "Casa do Passal" along with the creation within its walls of a museum and memorial site, and sponsoring US-based projects that perpetuate his legacy.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The year 2023 brought the end of most pandemic restrictions, but the beginning of a terrible war in the Middle East involving the largest massacre of Jews since the Holocaust. With the knowledge that Jews remain unsafe amid an alarming rise in global antisemitism, we need to redouble our efforts to teach the lessons of history.

The Sousa Mendes Foundation is dedicated to perpetuating the memory of the Holocaust hero Aristides de Sousa Mendes, Righteous Among the Nations. As the Portuguese Consul General in Bordeaux, France, he issued thousands of lifesaving Portuguese visas in 1939 and 1940 to refugees seeking to leave Europe as the

Nazis were overrunning the continent. In issuing these visas he went against the orders of his government, and simply followed his conscience. His act of moral courage can be an example for all of us today.



The Sunday programs, in which I have been privileged to participate these last several years, seek to bring to light stories in recent history, especially the Holocaust, that highlight acts of humanitarian courage, Dr. Mordecai Paldiel in the spirit of Aristides de

Sousa Mendes – the hero who symbolizes human behavior at its elevated best. In the words of Irena Sendler, who saved hundreds of children from the Warsaw Ghetto: 'The most important thing in the world and in life is goodness.' 99

In 2023 the Foundation continued with our popular series of Sunday programs on stories of rescue, resistance and hope beautiful true stories that are intended to inspire during these difficult times. Recordings of these programs are maintained on our YouTube channel as a permanent library of goodness.

We continue our collaboration with the Austrian Service Abroad program, and we are pleased to host intern Luis Liebl in 2023-24. Luis works alongside our great administrative team of Michael

McCabe and Matthew Spirn in making sure that our programs run smoothly and that our donors are promptly thanked, and he also works with our talented archivist Nicole Bubolo in maintaining our library and archive.

We organized a tour, Journey on the Road to Freedom, through France, Spain and Portugal, retracing the footsteps of the refugees of 1940. We continued conducting interviews with Sousa Mendes visa recipients about their memories of their escape from Nazi-occupied Europe. Our commissioned sculpture, Candelabro - Aristides de Sousa Mendes, was shown in Germany. And we hosted a Portuguese delegation for a study visit to our archive and library to plan the storyline and contents of the future Sousa Mendes Museum.

JOURNEY ON THE ROAD TO FREEDOM

Every few years, the Sousa Mendes Foundation organizes a very special tour called Journey on the Road to Freedom. This 10-night/11-day trip through France, Spain and Portugal retraces the footsteps of Aristides de Sousa Mendes and the refugees of 1940 from Bordeaux to Lisbon. In 2023 we organized our fifth Journey, and we had a fabulous international group of participants comprised of Sousa Mendes visa recipient families, members of the Sousa Mendes family, Holocaust educators and others interested in history. The tour co-leaders were Mariana Abrantes (Portugal), Cookie Fischer (entire trip), Hellen Kaufmann (Bordeaux), Dr. Olivia Mattis (France) and Dr. Heidi Omlor (entire trip).

What makes our tour unique is that it unfolds and reveals its lessons during the course of the experience. At each stop, participants narrate the tour themselves through testimonials and readings. The testimonials are family stories or anecdotes pertaining to the particular place being visited. Readings are eyewitness accounts from June of 1940 of the Fall of France, the refugee multitudes and the neutrality of Spain and Portugal. Accommodations on the Journey are all four- and five-star hotels, and the meals are bountiful and delicious.

Before the 2023 Journey, Dr. Heidi Omlor, Joan Arnay Halperin and Laura Seltzer-Duny, of our Educational Initiatives Committee, met with the teachers going on the tour to provide them with tools to use in the classroom, including the film Nobody Wants Us, the book My Sister's Eyes and a specially prepared PowerPoint slideshow. Following the tour, SMF Vice President Monique Rubens Krohn met with visa recipient family members to equip them with materials for telling their own family stories to groups in their home communities.

INTERVIEWS WITH SURVIVORS

As a follow-up to our 2022 Jerusalem street naming, Yad Vashem ceremony, and symposium, we conducted interviews in 2023 with two Sousa Mendes visa recipients living in Israel: Anna Thee (born in Belgium as Annie Wolf) and

Sarah Goodman (born in Germany as Sigrid Lustig). The interviewers were Avi Losice and Beatrice Brom, both children of visa recipients. These interviews have been edited by Joan Halperin and posted to our website. SOUSA MENDES VIDEO SCULPTURE ON VIEW IN GERMANY

In Ulm, Germany, Werner Klotz's multimedia sculpture, Candelabro - Aristides de Sousa Mendes, went on display in the famed Münster Cathedral on January 27, 2023 for an 8-week stay that attracted 68,000 visitors. The exhibit was coorganized by the Documentation Center of the Oberer Kuhberg concentration camp (DZOK); the Volkhochschule adult education center; and the Stadthaus, an exhibit and conference hall, and sponsored by the Ulmer / Neu-Ulmer Arbeitskreis 27. Januar. The main co-curators were Dr. Nicola Wenge, director of the DZOK, and Karla Nieraad, director of the Stadthaus. Opening day events included a speech by visa recipient descendant Dr. Jennifer Hartog, who was crucial to bringing the work to Ulm. A moving musical performance followed by singer/composer Almut Kühne and the Münster choir of the sound composition she created for the sculpture. Other programs throughout Candelabro's Ulm stay included a symposium with Sousa Mendes visa recipient descendants Mark Ginsburg, Monique Rubens Krohn (also SMF Vice President) and Harry Oesterreicher; and Sousa Mendes' great granddaughter, Cristiana Marohn; school programs directed by Annette Lein and Jennifer Hartog; a seminar for teachers, and an artist talk. The exhibition was featured in the newspapers Südwestpresse and Neu-Ulmer Zeitung.

THE FUTURE SOUSA **MENDES MUSEUM**

The transformation of the Sousa Mendes family home, "Casa do Passal," from a stately country mansion to the site of the future Sousa Mendes Museum gained momentum in 2023. Construction is ongoing throughout the large mansion, with a view to opening the museum in July of 2024. The museum project is under the leadership of Dr. Paulo Catalino, the Mayor of Carregal do Sal.

In January of 2023, the Sousa Mendes Foundation arranged, hosted and co-financed a Study Visit to New York for museum professional Suzana Menezes and historian Dr. Claudia Ninhos to view the Foundation's archival collection of objects, documents, photographs, films and other materials for use in the future museum. 


