
Aristides de Sousa Mendes,

Our popular **Sunday film-and-discussion programs** continue to attract a large audience. These programs feature fascinating true stories of rescue, resistance and hope on a panoply of subjects, with expert and engaging panelists such as filmmakers, authors, and survivors.

Also in 2025 the Sousa Mendes story entered the **New York State Holocaust education curriculum**, and we introduced a new and related touring exhibition, *Call Me Stefan*, thanks to the sustained, multi-year efforts of Board member **Leah Rozenfeld Sills**.

Our lead donor continues to be the **Tamara van den Bergh Ferguson Charitable Foundation**, named for a Sousa Mendes visa recipient who in 1940 escaped from the Netherlands, through France, Spain and Portugal, then served in the Free French Forces in England, and ultimately found safe haven in the United States.

On July 6-14, 2025 we held our first-ever Educators' Institute in Portugal on rescue and resistance during the Holocaust. The program began and ended in Lisbon, and in between we were in residence at the Aristides de Sousa Mendes Museum in Cabanas de Viriato. There, we occupied the sleek and modern top floor, with its classroom, seminar room and library. The books in the library — on rescue and resistance during the Holocaust and related subjects — had all been acquired and donated by the Sousa Mendes Foundation, so we felt right at home! Our diverse and talented group of teachers took field trips to museums and historic sites in Porto, Belmonte, Vilar Formoso and elsewhere. They conducted original research, made lively presentations and formed lasting friendships.

Leading the Institute were Mariana Abrantes, Cookie Fischer, Dr. Olivia Mattis and Dr. Heidi Omlor. Joining via ZOOM were filmmaker Laura Seltzer-Duny, author Louise Borden, artist Allan Drummond, and historians Dr. Jud Newborn and Dr. Mordecai Paldiel. Local experts — whom we appreciate so much — included Dores Fernandes, Luisa Pacheco Marques, Luis Medeiros, Margarida Ramalho, Josefa Reis and Hugo Vaz.





ANTI-DEFAMATION COURT CASE

In October of 2025, a lawsuit filed by four grandchildren of Aristides de Sousa Mendes against the far-right Portuguese magazine *O Diabo* and several of its authors ended in a settlement. At issue were a series of articles written in defamatory language, claiming falsely that in 1940 Aristides de Sousa Mendes had sold visas to people

crowded at the border and that these people were not in danger for their lives. In the end, the publication and its authors recanted their false claims, and the descendants therefore dropped their claim for financial damages. "The most important thing was not the money, it was the truth," said **Gerald Mendes**, one of the plaintiffs in the case.

AUSTRIAN SERVICE ABROAD — A SPECIAL PARTNER

Since 2022, the Sousa Mendes Foundation has partnered with the Austrian Service Abroad program based in Vienna. This program is an opportunity for Austrian young people, newly graduated from high school, to work in Holocaust education in place of their military service. The interns work as part of our team for a 10-month period, 34 hours/week, at no cost to the Foundation, and they return to Austria with a wealth of new life experiences and knowledge of history. Our wonderful interns in 2025 were **Emile Haffner** (2024-25) and **Robin Bigga-Piskernig** (2025-26) in New York and **Camillo Liebl** (2024-25) in Portugal.

EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

On May 8, 2025, Dr. Olivia Mattis spoke to museum docents and educators at the Holocaust Memorial and Tolerance Center in Glen Cove, NY about Aristides de Sousa Mendes and the work of our Foundation. During the Q&A, docent Mireille Taub explained that her own family escaped from Nazi-occupied Europe via Portugal in 1940, and she wondered if Sousa Mendes may have saved her life. A little research confirmed that indeed, her family received Portuguese visas in Toulouse, France in July of 1940 under the authority of Sousa Mendes. She then immediately signed up for our educators' trip — a journey that would prove life-altering. On June 17, Mattis spoke on the same topic to the 3GNY group of descendants of Holocaust survivors. Throughout the year, Cookie Fischer spoke to school groups in Portugal and led tours at the Aristides de Sousa Mendes Museum and the Chabad House in Cascais.
